# What's Happening at FMCE

We have a great committee with committed volunteers. We appreciate the acolytes we have, but we need more. A big thank you to Mrs. Betty Johnson who is committed to taking the flowers from the altar on Sundays and making small bouquets to take to shut-ins and those who are sick or bereaved.

## **Education Committee**

This committee is focusing on curriculum called "The Gospel Project" which is a three-year curriculum that covers the entire Bible and has everyone from the little ones to the older ones on the same page so when you get you home you can discuss with your family what each learned in Sunday School. Hopefully, it will be more meaningful for the family and will bring more to Sunday School. We're looking to start this in the fall when kids go back to school. We are looking to have a Sunday School campaign after Easter to encourage more attendance in Sunday School.

## **Celebrate Recovery**

We are averaging 100-120 every Tuesday night. Currently, members of our CR group go into three different prisons and our programs are well attended here and inside those facilities. We do need help in getting into our own Coffee County jail! On Saturday, April 6th, we are having a CR rally here in the Fellowship Hall. Folks from all around are invited to come to discuss how Celebrate Recovery can take the message out a little further and be more effective in the community as a whole.

## A Word from Pastor Matt

**A**pril is a fun season because it is in the middle of Spring. April isn't too hot, but also not too cold. Normally, a light freeze may happen at the beginning of April, then you know it is time to plant. It is before the busy season of graduation and family vacations. April is also a month of active weather and storms. I remember one April 2011, when my life changed. On April 27, 2011, a series of strong tornadoes ripped through the state in areas like Tuscaloosa, Arab, Phil Campbell, and others. In my hometown of Arab, one of these tornadoes passed less than a mile from my home and destroyed the home of one of my closest friends. He lost family members that day in the storm. I had never seen such destruction.

Storms arise often in the most unexpected places, seasons, and times. We can prepare all we want, but they still do their damage. Our preparation for storms, hard times, troubles, suffering, and days of anxiousness is more for the enduring of the trial than the removal of it. It is no misuse of language from the Psalmist when he says though he walks through the valley of the shadow of death the rod and staff of the Shepherd comfort him. He cannot walk around the darkest valley, but he must endure whatever it brings. However, it is the presence of God that comforts him the most as he endures whatever lies within the valley. So too with us my friends the troubles of life are often not removed no matter how much we pray or prepare. We must endure and we must endure faithfully. We must persevere. Don't give up my friends, but rely upon Christ and one another as we seek to endure all that life brings us for the glory of God. Have a blessed April.

# Pastor Billy's Notes

## AMAZING GRACE

John Newton, 1725-1807 (verses 1-4)

“And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times...you will abound in every good work.” ~2 Corinthians 9:8

Calling himself a “wretch” who was lost and blind, John Newton recalled leaving school at the age of 11 to begin life as a rough, debauched seaman.

Eventually, he engaged in the despicable practice of capturing natives from West Africa to be sold as slaves to markets around the world. But one day, the grace of God put fear into the heart of this wicked slave trader through a fierce storm. Greatly alarmed and fearful of a shipwreck, Newton began to read *The Imitation of Christ* by Thomas á Kempis. God used this book to lead him to a genuine conversion and a dramatic change in his way of life

Feeling a definite call to study for the ministry, Newton was encouraged and greatly influenced by John and Charles Wesley and George Whitefield. At the age of 39, John Newton became an ordained minister of the Anglican church at the little village of Olney, near Cambridge, England. To add further impact to his powerful preaching, Newton introduced simple heartfelt hymns rather than the usual psalms in his services. When enough hymns could not be found, Newton began to write his own, often assisted by his close friend, William Cowper. In 1779, their combined efforts produced the famous Olney Hymns hymnal. “Amazing Grace” was from that collection.

Until the time of his death at the age of 82, John Newton never ceased to marvel at the grace of God that transformed him so completely. Shortly before his death, he is quoted as proclaiming with a loud voice during a message, “My memory is nearly gone, but I remember two things: That I am a great sinner and that Christ is a great Savior!” What amazing grace!

It's April. We just ended the season of lent with the celebration of our Risen Savior on Easter Sunday. If you're like me, you gave up some aspect of technology during lent and are getting back into using it again. Something that I've noticed with kids, teens, and adults alike (especially myself) is the need for healthy boundaries when it comes to the use of phones, tablets, and TV. Amy Diller of Ministry to Parents, a subset of YM360, wrote a helpful blog on establishing boundaries with technology for yourself and your teens. She says, "As parents, we do know there are benefits to technology, and at the same time, we understand enough of the negatives to want to make wise decisions in this area. Whether you are just beginning to think about this topic or need to revise what you have in place, be encouraged that you can establish a great plan for technology in your home." Diller offers questions for self-evaluation, such as How often do I do anything without my phone?, Do I use my phone/tablet as a distraction?, and Do I practice device-free times at home? She also suggests a technology plan including the amount of time you'll allow devices, non-negotiable rules, and consequences when someone chooses not to follow the plan. I highly encourage you to have a family discussion about the use of devices and set some healthy boundaries together.

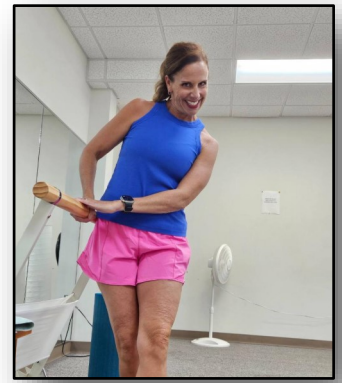

**The Huey-Adcock Scholarship** - awarded to the applicant with the highest score on the Scholarship Committee's criteria.

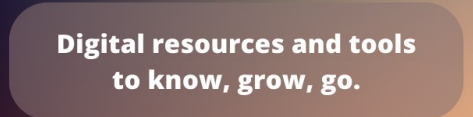
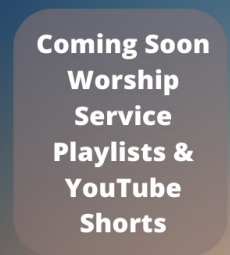
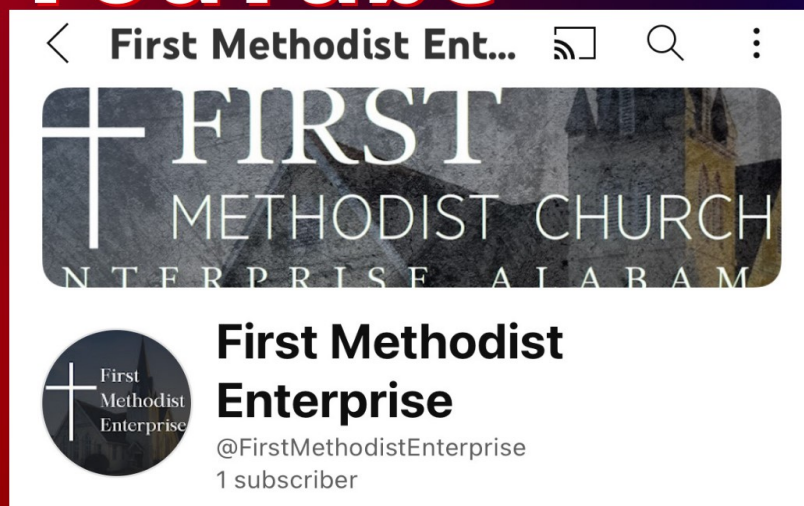
**The Baugh Scholarship** - awarded to an applicant who will be in a church related profession.

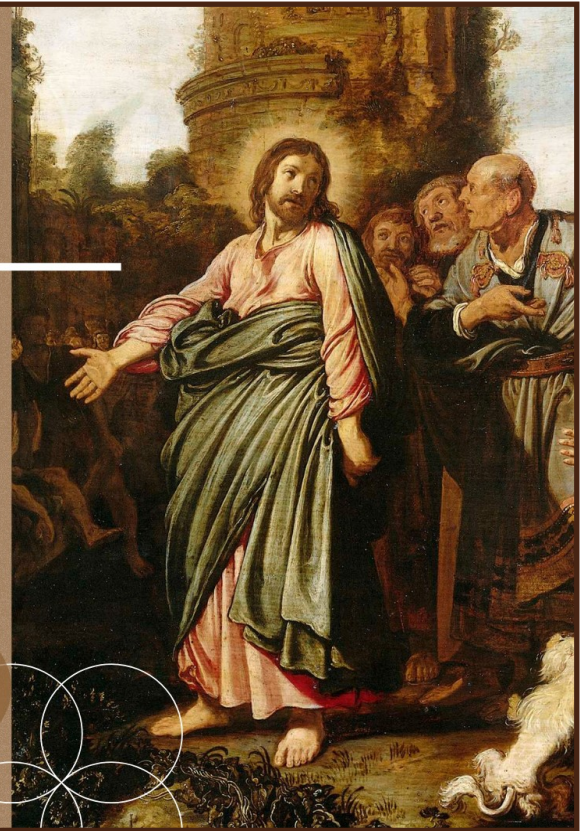

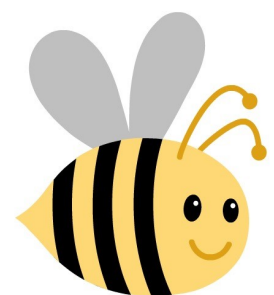

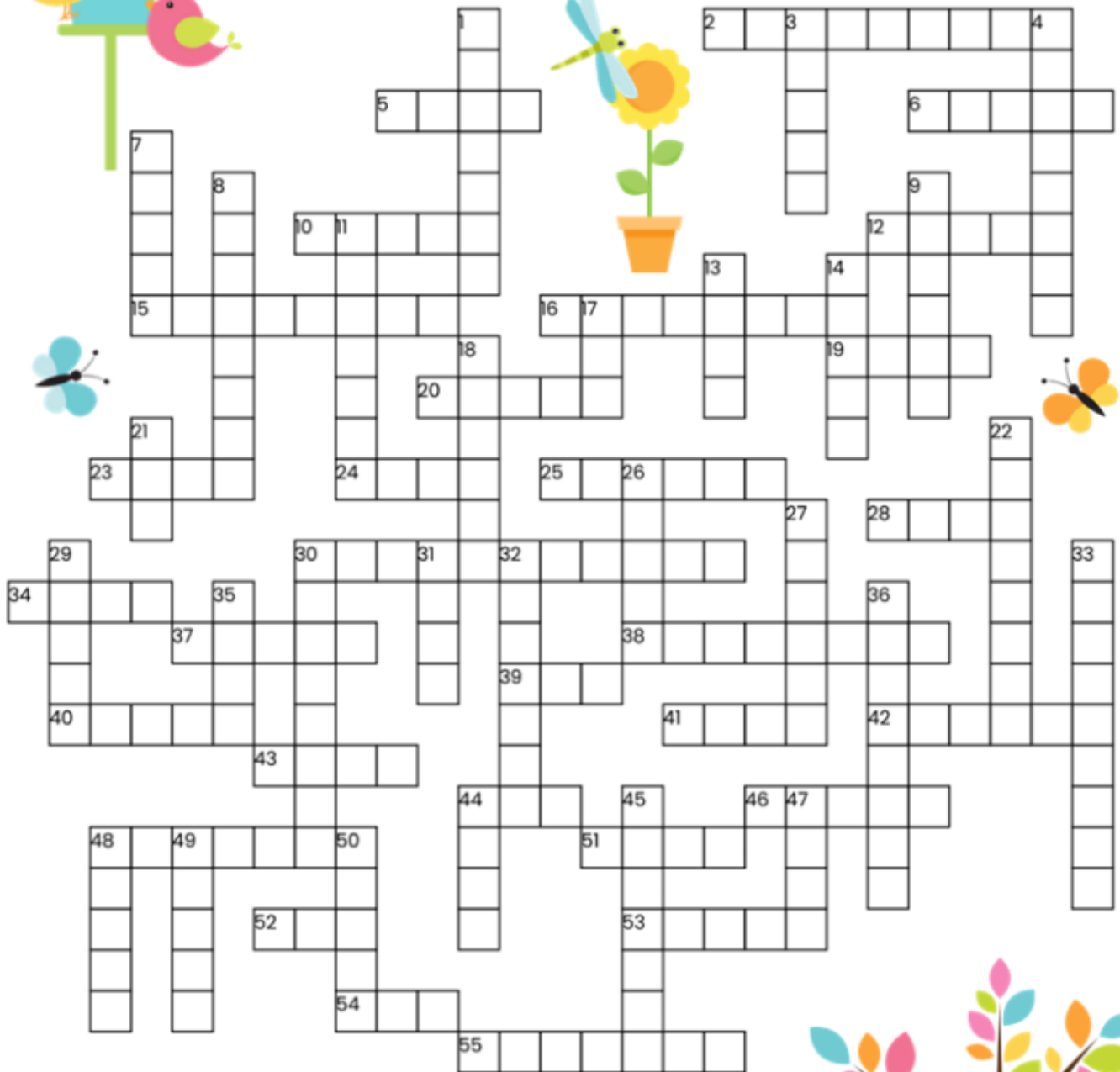
