

Busyness

A Word from Pastor Matt

ecember is a time of unlimited busyness for so many of us, especially those with children. One event after another, one more "thing" to do during Christmas, hunting elves on shelves, attending every light show known to man, and so much more. Even in the life of our church, many events are happening - the Kids' Nativity, Angel Tree Christmas Party, Christmas Eve services, Christmas Choir concerts, ministry and Sunday school parties. Is busyness bad? Some might say yes, but I think it's up in the air. Sometimes you can't control the events at school, sports, work, and even church. Sometimes you can't control the busyness; however, there are calmer times within our control - moments at breakfast in the mornings, bedtime routines at night, morning commutes, walks to and from the car, and any other moment, no matter how short, where nothing seems to be going on. Make the most of the silent moments, true conversations, prayer, reflection, and genuineness.

In a recent devotional, I read "Theology of Home," in which a mother said she never ate breakfast with her kids. They rushed, getting dressed and out the door. Everyone had their Poptarts, and the TV was on while everyone was getting dressed for school. They always ate dinner together around the table until one season, when they were spread so thin at night because of school activities, they couldn't sit around the table anymore. One morning, to the kids' surprise, the mother woke up a little earlier and made breakfast for everyone. The kids asked who died! They had lost the evening together, so she found a way to redeem the morning. Simply a few more minutes instead of scrolling, snoring, and snoozing, redeemed family time together. During this holiday season, I encourage you to find ways to maximize the "nothing" moments into redemptive moments. Find time to reflect, even if it is from one house or school to another. Find time to pray, to serve, to love, and to enjoy one another in this season as we are anticipating the coming of Christ and His glory. Find ways to redeem the morning.



Our Great Redeemer's Praise A NEW HYMNAL

s you are aware, since we left the United Methodist denomination, we have continued to use the United Methodist Hymnal. We want to replace those hymnals with a new hymnal entitled *Our Great Redeemer's Praise*. This hymnal embodies Wesleyan principles through its focus on God's prevenient, justifying, and sanctifying grace. It also contains a generous selection of hymns composed by Charles and John Wesley.


Our Great Redeemer's Praise is organized around the Apostles' Creed, and the 675 hymns are organized according to the twelve articles of the Apostles' Creed. What is the significance of organizing hymns around the Apostles' Creed, you ask? Organizing a hymnal around the Apostles' Creed is significant because it provides a strong theological framework for both singing and teaching. The creed offers a unifying structure that grounds worship in the core doctrines of the Christian faith, linking modern worshipers to the traditions of the ancient and global church.

The hymnal is a comprehensive, 800-page collection of 675 hymns that reflect the Wesleyan theological heritage and was published in 2022. It has many old favorites and new hymns throughout. *Our Redeemer's Praise* includes liturgies for Baptism and Holy Communion, creeds, prayers, and other responsive readings.

This hymnal comes in bright Red or Blue and sells for \$29.95 a copy. Replacing each hymnal is indeed costly, but a worthwhile long-term investment for our worship. You can support this ministry effort by donating one or more hymnals. You may also donate in honor of or in memory of a loved one wherein a label will be placed on the inside cover with their name, date, and a message of thanks for all who hold these precious words in their hands each Sunday.

Our goal is 265 hymnals: 225 blue-cover copies for the congregation and 40 red-cover copies for the choir. In seasons of change, rebirth is beautiful to behold. Please prayerfully consider joining us in this journey to see new life through song.

The Season of Advent

Ah, December, what many would call the busiest, most wonderful time of the year. There are all these demands on our time, bellies, and wallets, yet most would say they still love and highly anticipate the Christmas Season. Why? Because of the magic and wonder of it all. For centuries, the Church has helped believers prepare for this joyous time through the establishment of Advent, a season of prayer and fasting leading up to the celebration of Christ's birth. Advent helps us refocus our awe, calls us to make room for what's truly important, and reminds us of God's desire to be close to us.

Advent Is an Invitation to Wonder

As I emphasized in last month's newsletter, I'm aware of how easy it is to lose our sense of awe and wonder. Life becomes pragmatic: bills, jobs, relationships, responsibilities. The Christmas story, if we aren't careful, can become familiar enough to skim past. But Advent nudges us back toward awe. The incarnation is still astonishing—that the God who breathes galaxies into existence would take on the smallness of a baby. Becoming human wasn't a divine stunt; it was an act of unimaginable love. One of my favorite Advent moments is watching someone realize for the first time that the story of Jesus' birth is not just "God came near," but God came near to us. To our mess. Our questions. Our families. Our world. Advent keeps the wonder alive.

Advent Is a Call to Make Room

Parents often tell me they feel like they're running on empty by mid-December. There's a cultural pressure to create a magical holiday for their kids, while still carrying the emotional and spiritual load of their households. But Advent reminds us that the invitation is not to do more—it's to make room. Make room for quiet. Make room for Scripture. Make room for prayer. Make room for the Spirit to speak into the cluttered corners of our real lives. When families light Advent candles at home or practice simple daily devotionals, I see the shift happen: the season becomes less about managing Christmas and more about making space for Christ. And that shift doesn't require perfection—only willingness. The miracle of Advent is that God enters into whatever room we give Him.

Advent Is the Story of a God Who Comes Close

What Advent means to me, more than anything, is this: God doesn't wait for us to have it all together before He draws near. He comes into the vulnerability of our humanity. He enters the brokenness of our world. He steps into the longings we try not to name. He brings hope that is stronger than the darkest night. When I sit with a teenager wrestling with doubt, or a young adult overwhelmed with decisions, or a parent aching for God's peace in their home, I'm reminded that Advent is not abstract. It is deeply personal. It is the declaration that God comes close to ordinary people in ordinary life.

My prayer for us this Advent Season is to recognize God's presence in our midst, to wait with hope, and to make room for the Christ who came and is coming again.




