Sharing Your Faith

A Word from Pastor Matt

Have you ever considered how to share your faith, or even if that is something you should/can do? Evangelism is a critical part and responsibility of our faith. It is a clear command given to us by Jesus in Matthew 28:16-20 and Acts 1:8. This is also a tenet of our mission at FMCE: to live out Acts 1:8 intentionally and spread scriptural holiness. Perhaps it is obvious that a responsibility of the Christian is to share the gospel; however, according to Barna Group, only about 31% of Christians believe it is their personal responsibility to share their faith. This means, if the research is correct, nearly 70% of Christians don't feel it is their responsibility to share their faith. Research confirms that personal invitations are the most effective way to encourage church attendance. One of my professors, Dr. Wilson, once told me, "It is the call on every believer's life to share the Gospel." So, as February begins with all the Valentine's Day cards and talk about love, consider how you can share the greatest love by sharing the gospel with others. Look for opportunities to have intentional conversations about the gospel with those around you. Consider ways to initiate meaningful conversations about your faith with others. I remember one comedian who was an atheist shared about how much his Christian friends loved him, yet they never shared the gospel with him, and the punch line of his joke was how he wondered how much they really loved him, knowing he was going to hell. The church is the first line of defense for sharing the Gospel, and we know, friends, the church is not a building, but the people within it. It is up to us to share the good news!

Pastor Billy's Notes

Lord, Who Throughout These Forty Days

Claudia Hernaman (1838-1898)
United Methodist Hymnal, Page 269

Before Easter, Christians observe a season of Lent. The word “Lent” comes from the Anglo-Saxon word “Lenten” which means “Spring.” The 40 days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness enduring the temptations of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. For western churches that period begins on Ash Wednesday. This year it will begin Wednesday, February 18th. Lenten season lasts a total of 46 days, but Sundays are not included in the overall count. These Sundays are considered “mini-Easters.”

Christmas and Epiphany take place on the same dates each year, but Easter can fall anytime between March 22nd and April 25th. It is moveable based on the lunar calendar and it must fall on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. All other observances dependent upon Easter, including Lent and Pentecost, shift in relation to Easter’s timing. This year Easter falls on Sunday, April 5th, so the season of Lent will begin Wednesday, February 18th, 46 days before Easter, minus Sundays, and proceeding through Saturday April 4th.

The hymn “Lord, Who Throughout These Forty Days” signals the beginning of Lent. It is often sung during the Ash Wednesday service and through the Lenten season.

The number “40” has a special significance as well. The number 40 is mentioned some 146 times in scripture; It rained 40 days and nights during the Genesis flood; Noah waited another 40 days before opening the window of the ark; Exodus, Chapters 1-12, tells us the children of Israel were punished by wandering in the wilderness for 40 years before a new generation was allowed to possess the promised land, so it can represent a generation; Jesus was seen on earth 40 days after his resurrection; and Jesus’ 40 days in the wilderness provides an example for the 40 days of Lent.

Claudia Hernaman, (1838-1898), the author of this hymn was born in Surrey, England and died in Brussels, Belgium. She was the daughter of an Anglican minister and was also married to a minister. She wrote and translated over 50 hymns in her lifetime. This hymn first appeared in her “Child’s Book of Praise: A Manual for Devotion in Simple Verse” (1873). It was the mid-20th Century before it appeared in hymnals and first appeared in the Irish Church Hymnal in 1960. By the 1970’s it was a standard hymn in most hymnals in the United States. It is based on the temptation of Jesus found in the three gospels: Matthew 4:1-11; Mark 1:12-13; and Luke 4:1-13.

“Lord, Who Throughout These Forty Days” tells us how Christ’s life becomes a model for us to follow when we confront temptation. Stanzas one and two focus on the response of Christ when he faced temptation. Stanzas three and four encourage Christians to follow Christ’s example as we struggle with temptation; and stanza five focuses on looking forward to the joy of Easter.

The classic themes of the Lenten season are represented here:


- Fasting and prayer (verse 1)
- Struggle with Satan and sin (verse 2)
- Dying to self, meditation on scripture (verse 3)
- Penitence (verse 4)
- Looking toward the joy of Easter (verse 5)

During Lent I would challenge each of us to take one verse of this hymn per week, and while using the theme of that verse we each would examine our lives. And, as we do so, may the Holy Spirit show us unconfessed sin, bad habits, unresolved anger, or anything that we might need to remove from our lives.

Maybe this year, instead of giving up something good for Lent, such as chocolate, may we each give up something like a continuing sin, or a bad attitude. You get the idea!

Let us all be looking forward to the joy of Easter!!! “

Last month, Students went to DNOW26 hosted at Hillcrest Baptist Church. We had a blast with a scavenger hunt, silent disco, and SET (a new game Jacqueline and Wyatt Hines taught me). However, the most important thing is what we learned: there is NO OTHER NAME by which we worship and glorify than the name of JESUS.

Scripture repeatedly reminds us that names matter, not as labels, but as revelations of character, authority, and relationship. From the burning bush to the empty tomb, God reveals Himself by His name so that His

people might know Him, trust Him, and worship Him alone. In **Exodus 3:1–17**, Moses encounters God in the wilderness while tending sheep. Moses is far from power, far from Egypt, and far from confidence. Yet it is there that God speaks. From the burning bush, the Lord reveals His covenant faithfulness and discloses His name: “I AM WHO I AM.” This name communicates God’s self-existence and unchanging nature. He is not defined by Pharaoh, circumstance, or time. He is the God who sees the suffering of His people, hears their cries, and comes down to deliver them. Before Moses ever returns to Egypt, he must first know who God is. Deliverance flows from revelation.

Centuries later, God speaks again through the prophet Isaiah. In **Isaiah 42:6–9**, the Lord declares His purpose for His Servant: to bring justice, to be a light to the nations, and to open blind eyes. Then God makes a striking statement: “I am the LORD; that is my name; my glory I give to no other.” This is a direct contrast to lifeless idols that cannot save or speak. The Lord alone is faithful to declare the end from the beginning. **His name is inseparable from His glory, and He will not share it with another.** This prepares us for the breathtaking declaration of **Philippians 2:9–11**. After describing Christ’s humility—His willing obedience even to death on a cross—Paul proclaims God’s response: “Therefore God has highly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name that is above every name.” This is not merely a title of honor, but the public affirmation that Jesus shares in the divine identity of the Lord Himself. The result is universal acknowledgment: every knee bowing and every tongue confessing that Jesus Christ is Lord. This confession is “to the glory of God the Father.” Jesus does not compete with God’s glory; He reveals it. The name of Jesus fulfills what was promised in Exodus and Isaiah—God making Himself known as Savior.

How should God’s people respond to such a revelation? **Psalm 63:1–4** offers a fitting answer. David writes from the wilderness, longing for God with his whole being. He declares that God’s steadfast love is better than life, and therefore he will bless the Lord as long as he lives. This is not abstract theology; it is lived devotion. When we truly know who God is and what He has done, worship becomes our natural response.

From the bush that burned without being consumed, to the Servant who brings light to the nations, to the exalted Christ before whom all creation will bow, Scripture proclaims one unified truth: there is no other name by which God saves, reveals, and redeems. May we be a people who seek Him earnestly, worship Him wholeheartedly, and proclaim confidently that Jesus Christ is Lord—now and forever.

Hospitality in the New Year: Making Room for Grace

As we step into a new year, many of us set intentions—habits we hope to build, attitudes we want to carry, and ways we long to grow. A Call to Action

As we begin this new year, each of us can take part in the ministry of hospitality. Make it a personal commitment to welcome at least one new person—introduce yourself, invite them to coffee, sit with someone you don’t know well, or reach out with a note or message during the week. Pray for eyes to notice those who may feel alone and for courage to extend a genuine welcome. When each of us practices hospitality in simple, faithful ways, our church becomes a living testament to God’s call for hospitality from everyone and to everyone.




