Show Yourself Grace

A Word from Pastor Matt

As I write this newsletter article, I am in the middle of class, a class on spiritual formation. I am also writing this two days before Janis publishes the article! Both points are important. We all, every one of us, have both a spiritual life to nurture and a life to maintain. Jobs, families, service, bills, worship, and all the things in between that demand our time and energy. Even pastors get behind, sometimes on both! This month, I want to share some words of encouragement with you.

First, give yourself grace. The Lord shows His grace to us each time we sin. Ultimately, the greatest gift of grace is salvation and our place in the Kingdom of God. Show yourself grace when you are behind spiritually, when you beat yourself up because you are not meeting your standard.

Secondly, set standards that are attainable in your current life situation. If you set goals, spiritual goals, for a life that is different than your current situation it is not a beneficial rule of life and it will be more difficult to extend grace.

The greatest advice I could give you as I give it to myself is to acknowledge where you are now. If you are busy then create a rule of life around being busy: 10 minutes here, 20 minutes there, in your car, on the potty, in your closet hiding from spouses and kids for 5 mins of silence. However, it works make it yours to where your life is right now. Show yourself grace, be gentle with your soul, and acknowledge the truth of what you can do in this season, not the next.

Pastor Billy's Notes

Why Do We Sing?

Have you ever wondered why humans sing? We sing in our cars, we sing at work, we sing at play, we sing in the shower; I guess we presume we can't be heard in the shower while the warm water pelts us! A baby sings as the happy "goo goos" come from its mouth or the mother as she "la las" a crying baby to a comforting sleep. And don't we all, at times, catch ourselves humming a catchy tune, especially if we are trying to cover the fact that we don't know what we are doing!

Singing is a natural thing. All humans, unless physically handicapped, can sing. We can sing at any time, any place, day or night. Singing is one of those gifts that God has given only to humans.

Singing is just for humans. Birds may chirp a melodic line, a donkey may bray, and hyenas laugh. Still, only humans have the ability to blend words to create melody and harmony, producing a beautiful song sung by one or a whole community.

Did you know that God sings? God actually sings over you with loud singing. Zephaniah 3:17 says this: "The Lord your God is in your midst a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing." (ESV) This verse tells us five things about God. God is always with you; He is mighty, strong, brave, and He will save you; He takes great delight in you; He will quiet you with His love; and He rejoices over you with loud singing! Our God is a singing God; God the Father sings over His people here in Zephaniah v 17; God the Son sang before He went to the Garden to pray, Matt 26:30; God the Spirit sings today through the hearts and voices of we who love God and worship Him through truth and Spirit, Ephesians 5:18-21.

So, why do we sing? Because we can, and because we have a singing God! Singing is a marvelous gift God has given only to humans. And if God sings over us, don't you think He loves it when we sing and praise Him? So next time you are at church, in the shower, in your car, or anywhere, just let it rip! Sing loudly to God because, remember, God is singing loudly over you!

Do you like to sing? Have you ever thought of singing in a choir? If so, we have a place for you! Our new choir season begins with our first fall rehearsal on August 5th at 6:00pm in the Choir Room. We do need you and have a special place just for you. So, think about it and join the family!

Romans 8:9-17 | Living Like We Belong

One of the deepest longings of the human heart is to know where we belong. We often build our identity around our accomplishments, failures, careers, grades, athletic abilities, or the opinions of others. Yet in Romans 8:9-17, Paul gently reminds us that our truest identity is found in something far greater: we belong to God.

Paul writes that the defining mark of a follower of Jesus is not simply attending church, knowing Bible verses, or trying harder to be a better person. It is the presence of the Holy Spirit living within us. "If anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to him" (Romans 8:9). Through faith in Jesus, God doesn't merely forgive us; He comes to dwell within us, giving us new life and making us His own.

New Testament scholar N. T. Wright observes that throughout Scripture, God's presence moved from the tabernacle, to the temple, to Jesus Himself. Now, through the Holy Spirit, God's presence lives in His people. What an incredible privilege! Wherever we go, to our schools, workplaces, athletic fields, music rehearsals, community events, or around our own dinner tables, we carry the presence of Christ with us. Every conversation becomes an opportunity to reflect His love, grace, patience, and truth.

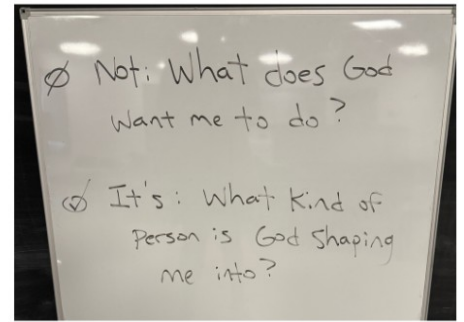
Wright's approach to Romans 8 is especially encouraging because it moves beyond simply "trying to be a better Christian" and instead asks, "What kind of people is God creating?" Paul isn't handing us a checklist of religious duties. He is describing people whose hearts are being transformed by the Holy Spirit.

This also changes the questions we ask. Instead of asking, "What does God want me to do?" Paul first asks, "What kind of person is God making me into?" That's a much deeper question. As God shapes our character, our decisions begin to reflect the heart of Christ naturally.

Paul also reminds us that we are no longer slaves to our old way of living. Through Christ, sin no longer has the final word. Even when we struggle, the Holy Spirit is faithfully at work, producing Christlike character in us day by day.

Perhaps the most beautiful truth of all is that we have been adopted into God's family. We are not merely forgiven sinners—we are beloved sons and daughters who can confidently call God, "Abba, Father." We don't obey Him to earn His love; we obey because we already have it.

Application Question: Whether you're heading to work, walking the halls of your school, leading a meeting, practicing with your team, or spending time with family, ask yourself: If I truly believed I am God's beloved child and that His Spirit lives within me, how would that shape the way I speak, serve, and love the people around me?

SPOTLIGHT ON THE CAREGIVERS SUPPORT GROUP

The First Methodist Church of Enterprise Caregivers Support Group has been organized and is working within the Enterprise community to service individuals and families affected by dementia, Alzheimer's, and other illnesses that require constant caregiving or home health support. The ministry, initiated in the fall of 2025, has seen steady increases in enrollment and has an outreach arm that reaches veterans and other organizations to bring awareness to the importance of caregivers, the necessity of sufficient caregivers, and the need for respite care. The group has been organized by retired nurses and other volunteers.

According to data from stacker.com, approximately 11.6% of Coffee County's 65+ population has Alzheimer's disease, which equates to approximately 1,100 people, a figure slightly lower than the 2024 State of Alabama statistic of 11.8%. Alzheimer's is the most common form of dementia, and among the top 10 causes of death in the U.S. Nearly all Alzheimer's patients are on government insurance, and estimates show that Medicare could [spend \\$2 billion to \\$5 billion annually](#) on lecanemab and related care. This number is significantly less compared to the [\\$345 billion that Alzheimer's and other dementias](#) cost in 2023, including nursing home stays, symptom management medications, and other care for those with the disease, but daunting, nonetheless.

The U.S. has a [shortage of specialists](#) in elder and memory-related medicine and nurses providing care at nursing homes and assisted-living facilities. In regions with high rates of Alzheimer's, these shortages could be particularly catastrophic within the current models of care.

According to Alzheimer's Impact Movement (AIM), more than 11 million provide care for the 7 million Americans living with Alzheimer's. This cost makes programs like the First Methodist Church of Enterprise Caregivers Support Group vitally important and donations even more so. To date, the program has been wholly supported by donations like yours. We hope to obtain some grant funding to enhance and improve this important service to the community of Enterprise and other surrounding areas.

Yet beneath the busyness, many families carry hurts, worries, and struggles that cannot be seen from the outside. That is why we are so grateful that Celebrate Recovery offers hope and healing for the whole family!

RENEWED & READY

This summer, we had the incredible opportunity to send nine Celebrate Recovery leaders to the CR Summit in Hendersonville, Tennessee.

We joined CR ministries from across the country, to worship, learn, and be reminded of the life-changing mission God has entrusted to us. Our leaders returned with:

- Renewed spiritual passion
- Stronger leadership unity
- Practical ministry ideas
- A fresh commitment to serving others well

We were reminded that Celebrate Recovery is far more than a weekly meeting. It is a safe community where people can experience the love of Jesus and take honest steps toward freedom from their hurts, hang-ups, and habits. Celebrate Recovery is a place where people can be known, loved, supported, and pointed toward the healing power of Jesus.

Several of our leaders are also pursuing training as Mental Health Coaches through Celebrate Recovery’s partnership with the American Association of Christian Counselors (AACC).

While our leaders are not therapists or counselors, this training will help them recognize when additional support may be needed, respond with compassion, and connect people with appropriate professional resources. We want to be a ministry that listens well, loves deeply, and helps people take the next step toward healing.

RECOVERY & HEALING: NOT JUST FOR ADULTS

As children and teenagers return to school, many face anxiety, loneliness, bullying, grief, family changes, unhealthy friendships, and the pressure to fit in. They need safe places where they can be heard, develop healthy

coping skills, and discover how deeply they are loved by God.

Celebration Place, for children in K through 6th grade, is often called the “precovery” ministry of Celebrate Recovery. Through age-appropriate lessons, worship, activities, and caring relationships, children learn biblical truths and healthy ways to process their emotions and experiences.

The Landing, for students in 7th through 12th grades, provides teenagers with a safe and supportive environment where they can be honest about what they are facing. They discover that they are not alone, their struggles do not define them, and Jesus offers hope, healing and a new direction.

As the new school year begins, please pray for our students, parents, teachers, school employees, and Celebrate Recovery volunteers. Pray that our ministry will continue to be a place where every generation feels welcomed, supported, and pointed toward Jesus.
