




#### FMCE FINANCE MOMENT

#### Awakening

#### A Word from Pastor Matt

f I were to ask you to pray for awakening, what is the first thing on your mind? Is it to wake up in the mornings without caffeine? Is it to awaken to the truth of news sources? Is it to awaken to the role of the Spirit in your life, or to be aware of sin? Awakening can mean many things, and in this newsletter, we won't have a single, definitive answer. Seedbed, a resource provided by Asbury Seminary alongside other conservative Wesleyan communities, emphasizes the necessity of prayer for awakening. On June 30th, our staff met for our annual planning meeting, where we specifically prayed for awakening. Our prayers are for our congregation to be awakened to the life-giving power of the Spirit, for Gospel awareness and conviction in our community, for future leaders to be raised in our church, for current leaders to be developed and discipled, and for our church to flourish in spiritual maturity. True growth isn't always about the numbers; it's about the profound understanding we gain of the mission Christ has given us to create disciples. Another term for awakening could be revival; to be revived in the Spirit, to walk with Him, and not just speak about Him. To be revived or awakened with a passion for the gospel, like when we first came to know Christ. To be revived or awakened with a passion for the lost and a passion for holiness. To be revived and awakened is and should be our prayer, so we seek for Christ to move. Pray for it, beg for it, and seek it in every facet of your life.

### Pastor Billy's Notes

#### Would You Consider Joining the Chancel Choir? How About Christmas Choir?

And when the song was raised [by singers with trumpets, cymbals, and other musical instruments] ... the house the Lord was filled with a cloud, so that the priests could not stand to minister because of the cloud; for the glory of the Lord filled the house of God.

(2 Chronicles 5:13-14)

his Scripture shows God's approval and describes the singing of the Levitical choir with its 288 singers (I Chronicles 25) and 4,000 musicians in all (1 Chronicles 23). Cymbals, harps, and 120 trumpeters accompanied them. As they sang and played, the glory of the Lord was revealed through the music with such power that all other ministry had to stop for a time.

Many scholars date the writing of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Chronicles around 400 years before Christ. So, we know for certain that at least for 2400 years large vocal choirs, wind instruments, stringed instruments, and percussion instruments have been a very important and necessary part of the worship of God. The choir's role today, as then, is one of worship leadership, whose members are dedicated, give freely of their time and talents, and have joyfully accepted the opportunities provided by the choir for advancing the Kingdom of God. The choir is a leadership group in hymn singing, playing instruments and worship; a priestly group, whose primary purpose is to lead and strengthen worship through singing and playing instruments. The choir is a crusading force, striving always to make worship more beautiful and valid.

The single most important thing we do as a church is to gather as a body of Christ and worship our God. We were created for this! Praise through music, as the above story tells us, is an integral part of that worship. The music ministry is a very important ministry of the church and those who are called to participate have an awesome responsibility.

As we begin this new choir season, we have several openings in the choir. We have openings for sopranos, altos, tenors, and baritones. If you can carry a tune, like to sing, and are willing to commit to Wednesday rehearsals and Sunday worship, we have a place for you. It is not necessary that you be a trained musician or even read music. In the average church choir, normally only a few can read music, and some have never sung in a choir before. Before making a commitment, if you would like to come to a few rehearsals just to see what it would be like, that would be great! Please think and pray about joining our family. We have a great time together! We meet at 6:00pm on Wednesday evenings in the choir room - A 200 (upstairs behind the sanctuary).

We will soon begin rehearsals for Christmas choir. If you would like to join, the rehearsals begin September 3rd. Christmas rehearsals will be each Wednesday at 6pm, and in the beginning and will be 30 minutes in length. As we get closer to performance dates, those rehearsals will increase in length to one and a half hours weekly. You will not have to commit to singing in the choir every Sunday. Childcare will be available for all rehearsals. Performance date for the Christmas program will be December 21<sup>st</sup>, at 3:00pm and 5:30pm.

Also, we have openings for Hallelujah Singers, Ju"bell"ation Ringers Handbells, Sisters In Song, Saved By Grace, and the Christmas orchestra. Contact me for more information about any of these groups.

We have a special place for you, so come and be a part of this magnificent centuries-old tradition of leading worship through music and praise. If you have any questions please contact me.

#### Go Live On Mission

#### SALT AND LIGHT AT SCHOOL AND WORK









In Matthew 5:13-16, Jesus calls us to a distinct and vital identity in the world: "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world." These verses are more than a call to personal piety—they are a commission to live out our faith boldly and publicly, wherever we find ourselves, including the classroom, the workplace, and every space we have opportunity. Jesus' metaphor of salt reminds us that our presence should preserve goodness and enhance the environment around us. Salt brings out flavor. In a bland or even bitter world, we are called to bring the flavor of grace, truth, and compassion. In the classroom, that might look like encouraging a struggling fellow student, acting with integrity even when no one is watching, or refusing to participate in gossip or cheating. At work, it might mean doing our jobs with excellence, speaking respectfully, or being the kind of person others can trust and confide in.

But salt also makes people thirsty. When we live lives that reflect Christ—lives of love, peace, humility, and joy—we make others curious. We invite questions. And those questions open doors to share why we live the way we do.

Jesus also says, "You are the light of the world." Light reveals truth. Light gives hope. Light drives away darkness. The environments we occupy daily are filled with all kinds of darkness: discouragement, selfishness, dishonesty, fear. But one small light changes everything. Whether you're sitting at a desk in high school or leading a meeting at your job, you have the opportunity to shine the light of Christ. Not with arrogance or superiority, but with love and authenticity. Jesus emphasizes that we should not hide our light. That's not always easy. There may be pressure to blend in, to keep our faith private, or to stay silent when something isn't right. But Jesus says, "Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." When we live for Him, others see Him.

Let this be your challenge and encouragement: You don't have to preach a sermon in the break room or pass out tracts in study hall. But you do have to live with purpose. You do have to reflect Jesus in how you speak, serve, and love. Be salt. Be light. And trust that God is using your witness to make an eternal impact.

Welcome to our new school year! MDO/SSP Open House is scheduled for Tuesday, August 5th stop by anytime between 11am-1pm to meet your child's teacher. Wednesday, August 6th will be the first day of classes. We are pleased that most of our teachers are returning from last year and welcome those who are new to our staff!

■ The first two weeks of school will be a time for children to get used to the routine of a new class room and all of our weekly activities. On Tuesday mornings the children ages 2 years - rising 5 year olds attend Chapel in the sanctuary at First Methodist

Church Enterprise and hear a Bible story from our church staff members and volunteers who help them recite their monthly Bible verse, lead them in a favorite song, and The Lord's Prayer. We appreciate so much that these dedicated people take time from their busy schedules to help our children grow spiritually and learn about Jesus and the Bible. The Core Knowledge curriculum that we use for 3s and 4s is a kindergarten readiness curriculum that focuses on literacy, stories and nursery rhymes, math, science, understanding time and space, work habits, and social skills. Classes for our younger children use a curriculum with thematic monthly units that introduce music, art, colors and shapes, the alphabet, counting and Bible stories in a loving, supportive environment. We look forward to an exciting new school year!

- Please do not park under the portico next to the gym or in the spaces marked for handicap parking in the Family Life Center parking lot. If you drop off or pick your child in the gym please DO NOT park under the portico.

# Hospitality

In a world that increasingly values convenience over connection, the Church is uniquely called to be different. One of the most powerful ways we can live out our faith is through radical ordinary hospitality—a quiet, consistent, yet profoundly transformative practice that reflects the heart of Christ. As I continue to read the book, *The Gospel Comes with A House Key*, by Rosaria Butterfield, I continue to be amazed at the simple ways we can enrich our hospitality skills using our home and the Church.

The phrase may sound contradictory at first. How can something be both radical and ordinary? Yet this is exactly what the gospel calls us to: a lifestyle of openness and welcome that becomes so deeply woven into our daily lives, it feels natural—even as it challenges cultural norms.

Radical ordinary hospitality is about making room in our lives, schedules, and hearts for others—especially the stranger, the outsider, the lonely, and the forgotten. It's about seeing our homes, not as personal fortresses, but as outposts of God's Kingdom. As it relates to the Church, it is about volunteering to not only do what is needed to sustain the Church and allow it to grow but to also establish a lifestyle where we are *prioritizing the Church and considering its needs.* It is embracing the place where we worship that allows us to continue to meet the requirements of God's commandments to consider others and to bring God's biblical vision to life in tangible ways. It requires intentionality that is deeply relational and at times will not feel like the norm. It is in the extra time that we spend to help others, not like us, to understand that they belong.

Scripture overflows with the call to hospitality. In Romans 12:13, Paul urges believers to "practice hospitality," and Hebrews 13:2 reminds us, "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." Jesus Himself modeled this in every interaction—welcoming children, sharing meals with sinners, and making room at the table for those the world rejected. We need to nourish the Mary and Martha in each of us.

In today's divided and fast-paced culture, *hospitality becomes a form of mission*. Many people are starving for community, craving spaces where they are seen and known. When the Church offers that space—not just in Sunday services but in everyday life—it becomes a beacon of hope.

As we move forward as a church, let's ask ourselves: Who is God calling me to welcome? How can I use my home, my time, my resources, to reflect His love? How can I use my time to volunteer to make ordinary radical hospitality the norm?

Consider starting small—invite a new church member over for coffee, find a need in the church and volunteer, or greet someone new each Sunday with genuine warmth. Consider answering the call to volunteer in the areas that you feel are important to facilitate a new normal. Together, we can build a culture of radical ordinary hospitality that transforms lives—ours included. Let's be known as a church where no one feels like a stranger for long. Please let me know how I can facilitate your journey.


